a message from the Executive Director

It's been a tough year for CASA, and it's been a great year for CASA.

Children have come into the foster care system in our county at a rate 38% higher than in the previous year. Our conservative projections had been a 4 - 6% growth. This means we've been struggling to recruit high-quality volunteer Advocates fast enough to keep up with the kids coming into the system. And we've done it! For the second full year in a row, we've provided every single child every single child - in the foster care system in our county with a CASA Advocate. We are one of only a handful of CASA programs in Texas and in the country who accomplish this.

97% of our children were served by volunteers. This is a truly unique organization in which the real "mission work" - changing the lives of children - is done by volunteers! Volunteers who can concentrate their "powers for good" on one case at a time. For twenty-five years, CASA Child Advocates of Montgomery County has been the leading voice for abused and neglected children. In those years, we've helped more than 8,000 children - because of you.

In addition to serving every child, we work continually to improve the quality of our advocacy. This year:

- We implemented trauma-based training for all of our Advocates. Every child who's been the victim of abuse and neglect and then removed from their parents has suffered trauma. In fact, 25% of youth who age out of the foster care system will have PTSD. This trauma changes a child's brain, and we need to interact with them in a different way to help redirect the brain cells.
- We've expanded our searches for families for children to include looking for family members who will be ongoing support for the kids, even if they cannot become the primary caretakers.
- We added a transportation pilot to expand our Advocates' effectiveness by allowing them to transport their
- We developed a program to help mothers of infants and toddlers better understand how to relate to their kids.
- We provided youth with life skills training, including nutrition and meal prep, car buying, budget management, and campus visits.

Fiscal responsibility is always at the top of our minds. We ended the year on target, with a cash reserve of just over 6 months of operating expenses. This is the goal set by the Board in order to ensure that our work with abused and neglected kids is sustainable. We appreciate your support!

What is a CASA Volunteer?


When a child enters the foster care system because his or her home is no longer safe, a judge may appoint a committed volunteer to help them. That volunteer is called a **Court Appointed Special Advocate**, or CASA.

CASA Volunteers

- O Are screened and HIGHLY TRAINED
- Are APPOINTED BY JUDGES to represent and advocate for a child's best interests in the child protection system
- @ Are assigned to HELPONE CHILD or set of siblings at a time
- OServe as the "EYES AND EARS" for the judge
- ORESEARCH each child's situation
- Make OBJECTIVE RECOMMENDATIONS to help each child reclaim their childhood from abuse and neglect
- Are frequently the ONLY STABLE PRESENCE in the child's life as they navigate the foster care system
- Save taxpayers money and children's futures by helping children find SAFE, PERMANENT HOMES as soon as possible

Who are CASA Volunteers?

CASA volunteers are people just like you - objective, compassionate, self-motivated individuals from the community. They come from all walks of life and backgrounds. Some work full-time and others stay at home or are retirees. All are passionately committed to making a difference for children who might otherwise slip through the cracks in an overburdened foster care system.



- @Be at least 21 years old
- Successfully pass CPS screening & background check
- Successfully complete 30 hours of online & classroom training (plus 3 hours of court observation)
- @ Be able to make a 12 month commitment to a case
- O Be computer literate and have access to a computer
- @ Have a driver's license and personal transportation
- Be objective, tenacious, wise, and care very deeply about making a difference for kids

Volunteers by Tenure









Volunteer Growth Rate

It all started with 8 volunteers. Eight people who saw a need in Montgomery County and rose to the occasion. Thanks to their tireless dedication and the endless hours of work put in by those that came after, CASA Child Advocates of Montgomery County is now 261 volunteers strong - more than 32 times its original size.

Meet Emily, Abigail, & Jeffrey

The two girls, Emily, 8, and Abigail, 4, had suffered abuse at the hands of their biological mother's friend. Their mother was away at work when the man she thought was a friend and charged to look after the young girls, beat them. Young Abigail's injuries were so severe that she was transported to the hospital via Lifeflight and was not expected to live. Hospital personnel alerted authorities and the girls were placed into the care of Child Protective Services (CPS).

Heather, a CASA Advocate, stepped up and took the case. She visited the hospital and talked with Abigail's doctors and nurses. Heather was not only a CASA Advocate; she was also a doctor. She knew exactly what questions to ask of Abigail's doctors. As the days and weeks rolled on, Abigail began to recover, and her physicians called her their "miracle child".

Emily had been placed in a group home, and when Abigail had healed and was released from the hospital, she was placed in the same group home as her sister. Heather felt they needed to be in a home where they could receive the sole attention of their caregivers, and worked with CPS to find a foster home that would provide what the girls needed. The girls were placed with foster parents, Cyndi and Steven, and for the first time, experienced what a safe and loving home feels like.

Then, Heather learned that the girls had a brother, Jeffrey, living with Emily's grandmother. This young boy had special needs - he could only eat through a gastronomy tube and displayed violent tantrums. One of the nurses who helped care for Jeffrey had concerns about his health and welfare and asked CPS to investigate his living conditions. CPS removed Jeffrey, but did not place him with Cyndi and Steven as they were not licensed to foster children with Jeffrey's medical needs.

But foster mom Cyndi was also a physician. Cyndi and Heather persisted in their attempts to have Jeffrey placed with his sisters. CPS agreed, and the family became whole again.

Emily, Abigail and Jeffrey have now been adopted by Cyndi and Steven and are thriving.

Abigail, who very nearly lost her life, is now in school and loves to play princess. Jeffrey no longer needs a feeding tube and loves playing soccer at school. Eldest sibling, Emily, describes the difference her Advocate, Heather, made, "Miss Heather is really fun, and I love having her to be a part of my life and helping her to find me a wonderful home." Because of Heather's efforts, the three siblings are able to start a new life together, protected and loved.


