This year, we celebrated our third year of providing EVERY child in care with an Advocate to look out for his or her best interest and make sure their voice was heard in court. We are one of just a handful of CASA programs in the state who are able to serve 100% of children in care.

98% of our children were served by volunteers, not staff. This is a truly unique organization in which the real "mission work" -- changing the lives of children -- is done by volunteers!

Fiscal responsibility is always at the top of our minds. We ended the year with a cash reserve of 6 months of operating expenses. This is the goal set by the Board in order to ensure that our work with children is sustainable. We sincerely appreciate your support.

But our fight is not over. About 6 children come into the foster care system in Montgomery County EACH WEEK. We must continue to speak for every child who needs us.

These kids need your help. With your support of CASA, in dollars or time, or both, you're making it possible for kids who've had the most rotten breaks a chance for real and lasting change for their future.

WHAT DOES CASA DO?

Follow a CASA volunteer's journey to help a child find her forever home.



WHAT IS A CASA VOLUNTEER?

When a child enters the foster care system because his or her home is no longer safe, a judge may appoint a committed volunteer to help them. That volunteer is called a

Court Appointed Special Advocate®, or CASA.

CASA VOLUNTEERS

- Are screened and HIGHLY TRAINED
- Are APPOINTED BY JUDGES to represent and advocate for a child's best interests in the child protection system
- Are assigned to HELP ONE CHILD or set of siblings at a time
- · Serve as the "EYES AND EARS" for the judge
- RESEARCH each child's situation
- Make OBJECTIVE RECOMMENDATIONS to help each child reclaim their childhood from abuse and neglect
- Are frequently the ONLY STABLE PRESENCE in the child's life as they navigate the foster care system
- Save taxpayers money and children's futures by helping children find SAFE, PERMANENT HOMES as soon as possible.


WHO ARE CASA VOLUNTEERS?

CASA volunteers are people just like you -

objective, compassionate, self-motivated individuals from the community. They come from all walks of life and backgrounds. Some work full-time and others stay at home or are retirees. All are passionately committed to make a difference for children who might otherwise slip through the cracks in an overburdened foster care system.

WHAT QUALIFICATIONS DOES AN ADVOCATE NEED?

- Be at least 21 YEARS OLD
- Successfully pass CPS SCREENING & BACKGROUND CHECK
- Successfully complete 30 HOURS of online & classroom training*
- Be able to make a 12 MONTH COMMITMENT to a case
- Be COMPUTER LITERATE and have ACCESS to a computer.
- Have a DRIVER'S LICENSE and personal transportation
- Be objective, tenacious, wise, and CARE VERY DEEPLY about making a difference for kids









MEET MILLIE, BRYCE, LANDON & RILEY

Siblings Millie, Bryce, Landon and Riley spent the early years of their lives surrounded by an environment of domestic violence, unsanitary and unsafe conditions, and drug use. When the sibling's mother went on out of town with her boyfriend, she left the children with their grandmother.

But the children were again put in a potentially dangerous situation as the grandmother lived with a registered sex offender.

Child Protective Services (CPS) was notified of the situation and CPS investigators on the scene determined that, for their safety, the children needed to be removed at once.

The home itself was beyond deplorable. The four children were covered in insect bites and layers of dirt. They were without clothing or wearing only underclothes. The children were in such bad shape that they were taken to the CPS office immediately to be bathed and clothed.

At 3:00 in the morning, the children were placed with foster parents. Shortly after, CASA Advocate, Susan Munkres, stepped up to take the case.

CPS extended an initial goal of reunification to the children's biological mother and ordered that she complete a comprehensive service plan. She received counseling and took parenting classes. The children were allowed visits to her apartment. On the surface, it appeared that she was doing everything right to turn her life around and have her children returned to her.

But Advocate Susan sensed something wasn't quite right. She noticed discrepancies and inaccuracies in some of the mother's statements. Susan visited with the mother's neighbors and apartment management and uncovered disturbing behaviors that violated CPS stipulations. Susan revealed her findings to CPS and attorneys, and all agreed that returning the children to their mother was no longer in their best interest.



The children's mother made the brave decision to relinquish her parental rights to allow her children the opportunity to grow and thrive in a healthy and loving home.


All four children were adopted by the same foster parents who welcomed them home in the middle of that first night, Tim and Holly. They continue to heal from the physical and emotional wounds of their young lives, but they are surrounded with love and support from their parents.

Millie loves to draw pictures for her mom, Bryce enjoys playing baseball and has quite the arm, Landon thinks his dad is a super-funny guy, and 3 year-old Riley lights up a room with her easy smile and infectious laugh.

Thanks to the efforts of Susan, their CASA Advocate, Millie, Bryce, Landon and Riley are free from the cycle of abuse and thriving in a safe, permanent and loving home.




