### **A Message from the Executive Director**



I am extremely honored to serve the community as the new Executive Director of CASA Child Advocates of Montgomery County. Please allow me to introduce myself. I am a native Wisconsinite. I am a nurse and I have worked in hospital administration and also taught nursing. My husband and I are parents to 5 children, three of whom are adopted.

I came to CASA as a volunteer 6 years ago. I am very proud to have been an Advocate for 13 children over those six years. Three years ago, I joined the CASA staff as the Training Director. I am passionate about the work we do because I have seen firsthand the incredible impact an Advocate can have.

It has been quite a year for all of us. Everything changed overnight. Pivot became the word of 2020. Here, at CASA Child Advocates of Montgomery County, pivot we did. Almost overnight we transitioned to new and innovative ways of serving every single child in care in Montgomery County.

As the pandemic raged on, adult stressors increased. Families struggled with substance abuse, domestic violence, depression, and food insecurity. The children we serve were quite literally trapped with their abusers. No safe adults were able to see our kids and as a result, intakes went down significantly.

For those of us who work in child welfare, the silence---was deafening. When school reopened last fall, children coming into care dramatically increased. We saw monthly increases of up to 77% in the reported cases of abuse. Not only did the number of children coming into care increase, but the severity of the abuse and neglect they suffered also intensified.

According to Ernst & Young, more than 70% of non-profits cut back the services they provide during the pandemic. At CASA, not only did we not reduce the services we provide, but our 350 volunteers continued to serve EVERY SINGLE CHILD...or 680 children. 2020 is the fifth year in a row we have served 100% of the children in Montgomery County.

Financial responsibility is always a priority for us at CASA. We end the year with cash reserves of 11 months of operating expenses. This is a goal set by our board and it ensures our ability to continue to serve every single child.

During the pandemic, when so much of the world's focus was turning inward, CASA continued to make sure EVERY SINGLE CHILD in Montgomery County was safe. CASA's presence ensured that those making decisions kept the child's best interest their highest priority.

CASA Advocates change the trajectory of children's lives. The work we do is powerful, because it is not ONLY about this child in care that we are Advocating for. It is about the ripples that come from changing not only the life of this child, but rather about the generations that follow this child that go on to live healthy lives, unimpacted by trauma.

Our work is not over. On average 6 children enter foster care in Montgomery County each week. We must continue to ensure that the best interest of these children remains the focus of everyone in the child welfare system.

Thank you for your generous support of the most vulnerable children in our community. Whether you are a donor, board member, volunteer or someone with a heart for children, thank you. Your support ensures that we can continue to serve EVERY SINGLE CHILD in Montgomery County.





# What is a CASA volunteer?

When a child enters the child welfare system due to allegations of abuse or neglect, a CASA volunteer may be appointed by a judge to advocate for the child and family. That volunteer is called a

COURT APPOINTED SPECIAL ADVOCATE®, or CASA.

### CASA VOI UNTFFRS

- Are screened and HIGHLY TRAINED
- Are APPOINTED BY JUDGES to represent and advocate for a child's best interests in the child protection system
- Are assigned to HELP ONE CHILD or set of siblings at a time
- Provide VALUABLE INFORMATION to the judge and others involved in the case to ensure the child's best interest
- RESEARCH each child's situation
- Make OBJECTIVE RECOMMENDATIONS to help each child reclaim their childhood from abuse and neglect
- Are a CONSISTENT PRESENCE in the child's life as they navigate the foster care system
- Help maintain a SENSE OF URGENCY to all children's cases
- Recognize that PERMANENCY IS ESSENTIAL for a child's well-being

## Who are CASA volunteers?





### CASA VOLUNTEERS ARE PEOPLE JUST LIKE YOU -

objective, compassionate, self-motivated individuals from the community. They come from all walks of life and backgrounds. Some work full-time and others stay at home or are retirees. All are passionately committed to make a difference for children who might otherwise slip through the cracks in an overburdened foster care system.

### WHAT QUALIFICATIONS DOES AN ADVOCATE NEED?

- Be at least 21 YEARS OLD
- Successfully pass CPS SCREENING & BACKGROUND CHECK
- Successfully complete 30 HOURS of online & classroom training\*
- Be able to make a 12 MONTH COMMITMENT to a case
- Be COMPUTER LITERATE and have ACCESS to a computer
- Have a DRIVER'S LICENSE and personal transportation
- Be objective, tenacious, wise, and CARE VERY DEEPLY about making a difference for kids



### 2020 CHILD STATISTICS









# Meet AJ, John, Audrey, Jeffrey and Harley... and their Advocate, Joe!

Siblings, AJ, John, Audrey, Jeffrey and Harley often felt like they were treading on thin ice, never knowing whether their next step would hold or not. Their parents were addicted to illegal drugs and while under the influence, would often become emotionally and physically violent. Oldest brother, AJ, watched as his dad held a knife to his mother's throat on one occasion. He also became used to the back and forth arguments but knew that when his mother's screaming suddenly stopped, it most likely meant that his father had knocked her unconscious.

The children's parents would also leave the five siblings home alone for days or weeks at a time. Without adults to take care of them, AJ – at the young age of about 9 or 10 – began to step up in the role of caretaker for his younger brothers and sisters.

Left to fend for themselves, the children would ask neighbors for food. The neighborhood was known for illegal activities, and to prevent authorities from coming into the neighborhood, the children's neighbors would order pizza for them or give them cans of Spaghettios.



Finally, Child Protective Services became involved and, concerned for their safety, removed the children. Friends of the family - Tina, Johnny, and their teenage son, Corey - volunteered to take the siblings in, afraid they might be separated in foster care.

At this time, Joe, a volunteer CASA Advocate, stepped up and took the case. During his first meeting with AJ, John, Audrey, Jeffrey, and Harley, he noticed they lined up nervously on the sofa. They seemed to wait for Joe to interrogate them and were afraid of giving a wrong answer.

Joe understood the siblings had already been through so much and wanted them to feel comfortable talking with him. Instead of structured meetings, Joe wanted to try something different.

Joe began attending the kids' events – whether it was AJ's football games on Friday nights, Audrey's volleyball games after school, or a family camp out at Lake Conroe – and was able to get to know each child in a relaxed and comfortable environment. The children began to trust Joe and knew that he was there to look out for their best interests.

As the case progressed, it was determined that the children's biological parents could not provide a safe environment, and their rights were terminated. Tina, Johnny, Corey and the five siblings were excited to be able to proceed with their adoption, and an adoption date was set for November.

Three days before adoption day, the CPS attorney called Tina. A single document was missing a signature. The adoption would not be happening as scheduled and the attorney did not know when another date would be set. Heartbroken and confused, the first person Tina called was Joe.


Joe told Tina, "I'm working on it! I'm not sure what I'm going to do, but I'm going to do my best to get you another adoption date before the end of the year."

Joe made phone calls, pleaded with case workers, and worked tirelessly on behalf of the five siblings. Joe excitedly called Tina to let her know that another adoption date had been set for December 21st. They would be an official family by Christmas.

On adoption day, Johnny, Tina, Corey, AJ, John, Audrey, Jeffrey and Harley walked up the courthouse steps to find Joe right there, ready and waiting for them. Tina refers to Joe as a "miracle worker." AJ explains, "[Joe] is warm-hearted. He cares about his job and really cares about the kids he's working for. AJ continues, "With Joe being there and seeing how our everyday life was, him being the Advocate, it really, truly – I feel like – was the reason that we got adopted. And once the day came, everything becoming official, it was cool. It was unreal, honestly."

BECAUSE OF JOE'S EFFORTS, THE SIBLINGS' FUTURES LOOK BRIGHT...AJ, JOHN, AUDREY, JEFFREY AND HARLEY ARE SAFE, LOVED, AND FREE OF THE CYCLE OF ABUSE.

# **Creating Connections for Children in Care**

### TRUST BASED RELATIONAL INTERVENTION (TBRI)

TBRI® is an attachment-based, trauma-informed intervention that is designed to meet the complex needs of vulnerable children. TBRI® uses Empowering Principles to address physical needs, Connecting Principles for attachment needs, and Correcting Principles to disarm fear-based behaviors. While the intervention is based on years of attachment, sensory processing, and neuroscience research, the heartbeat of TBRI® is connection.

Although our TBRI efforts looked a little different in 2020, the CASA Child Advocates' team of 6 TBRI Practioner staff members continued to coach parents, foster parents and kinship placements virtually. The TBRI Team also offered trainings for our volunteers, focusing specifically on how to build connection with children virtually (video chat while coloring on the same sheet, reading a book together, playing a game virtually, or bringing a pet onto the Zoom chat.)

CASA Child Advocates of Montgomery County trained outside organizations on TBRI and trauma-informed care including Galveston CASA, Conroe ISD, Lonestar College of Nursing, and local attorneys.

### **COLLABORATIVE FAMILY ENGAGEMENT (CFE)**

CASA Child Advocates of Montgomery County was one of the first programs in the state of Texas to begin implementing Collaborative Family Engagement (CFE) on our cases. Now, more than 6 years later, Advocates use CFE tools readily on every case.

The main goals of Collaborative Family Engagement (CFE) are to avoid removing children from their family of origin whenever possible, and to help children achieve strong connectivity and permanency faster, preferably with relatives or other trusted loved ones.

In 2020, CASA Child Advocates continued to train Advocates on CFE principles. Volunteers received certificates of completion for a 3-part CFE training series, held virtually.

A CFE virtual training was conducted in August 2020 for new CPS caseworkers at the request of a CPS Supervisor. The training focused on understanding on how CFE tools work and understanding the CFE process initiated by CASA.

Family member support increased in Family Group meetings during 2020; virtual meetings made it more convenient for parents and family members to be more involved in the CPS process.

In collaboration with the Department of Family & Protective Services (DFPS) and community partners, we are working to ensure that every child in foster care has the opportunity for lifelong connections.

# Focusing on Children's Specific Needs



### GIFT PROGRAM

The GIFT Program provides Advocates with special training and resources for cases involving infants and toddlers. In 2020, GIFT leads hosted GIFT trainings every 3-4 months for Advocates, moving their training online during the pandemic. They also increased the pregnancy and parenting resources available for Advocate use.

### **CASA4TEENS INITIATIVE**

In 2019, CASA Child Advocates of Montgomery County announced a new approach for teen outreach. The program, "CASA4Teens" (formerly the "Fostering Futures" program), aims to increase successful outcomes for youth aging out of foster care.

The CASA4Teens steering committee consists of a mix of CASA staff, Advocates, and community partners. In 2020, this group met with leaders from Texas CASA, National CASA, other local CASA offices, DFPS, and non-profits working with teenagers to determine best practices and identify gaps in services for foster youth.

As a result of their extensive research, urgent needs were determined and projects were put in place in an effort to meet those needs. This group developed a teen tracking system with a 24-point assessment that is to be conducted quarterly on all teens in care. This will be used to create individualized care plans for teens, track their individual progress, and provide insights that will our intervention efforts as a program.

Together with Rebecca Smith, LPC-S, they explored a foster youth substance abuse recovery program.

Members of the committee worked in partnership with DFPS facilitators to improve the quality of and increase the occurrence of support meetings for teens, focusing on strengthening their support systems and creating plans for the teens once they exit care.

A partnership was also created with Leadership Montgomery County to plan for Game of Life 2021, an event that will give the teens life skills experience while maintaining safety in the continuing COVID pandemic.

Three Advocate gatherings were conducted specifically for Advocates who support teens. This included an Advocate roundtable, a training on the Texas Education Training Voucher, and a training on how to support teens through the COVID pandemic.

# Educational Advocacy



### HANDLE WITH CARE

CASA Child Advocates of Montgomery County is proud to have partnered with the Montgomery County District Attorney's Office on a collaborative initiative called "Handle with Care." Handle with Care is a program that enables local law enforcement to notify local school districts when they encounter a child at a traumatic scene, so school personnel and mental health partners can provide appropriate trauma-sensitive interventions immediately.

Handle With Care requires:

- Law enforcement to send notification to schools
- Schools to receive notifications and prepare for trauma-sensitive support

The goal is to set schools up to better help children exposed to trauma focus, behave appropriately, and learn.

The Montgomery County Handle with Care program is currently the only county-wide program in Texas.

### **EDUCATION COMMITTEE**

The Education Committee is made up of many specialists from the education field, mostly retired. This includes a retired superintendent of schools, a retired principal and ESL specialist, a retired school counselor, a retired educational diagnostician (special ed) and a retired gifted and talented specialist. The committee also recently added a behavior specialist.

The Education Committee is available to answer any questions related to the success and or struggles of our children in school. Members of the committee offer to attend meetings with Advocates such as ARD meetings or 504 meetings.

CASA Case Supervisors submit questions regarding education which are then referred to the committee specialist. On a monthly basis, the committee fields an average of 10 questions from volunteers.

The Education Committee has written helpful blog articles for the CASA website and has also contributed articles and videos for drip learning by text message for Advocates.

### **ANTI-TRAFFICKING INITIATIVE**

Human trafficking, which is the exploitation of people for sexual servitude, forced labor, or financial gain, is rampant in many countries and is thought to generate over \$30 billion worldwide. Here in the U.S., the FBI estimates that over 100,000 children are victims of sex trafficking.

Foster children are particularly vulnerable to falling victim to sex trafficking and other forms of human trafficking. 60% of all child sex trafficking victims have histories in the child welfare system.

CASA Child Advocates of Montgomery County had planned two in-person human trafficking training for 2020 prior to the pandemic. The two trainings were then converted to Zoom meetings.

Texas CASA created the Commercially Sexually Exploited Children (CSEC) Course that became available in February of 2020. This free course was created to help Advocates identify victims of trafficking, understand the unique needs of exploited youth, and provide them with the highest level of advocacy. The course has 9 modules and takes approximately 2.5 hours to complete. CASA asked our volunteers to register and complete this online training then come together virtually on Zoom to discuss what they had learned. About a dozen Advocates took the course, advancing their knowledge on this important issue.

### **FOCUS ON INCLUSION AND DIVERSITY**

In 2020, CASA Child Advocates of Montgomery County was one of six Court Appointed Special Advocate (CASA) organizations from across the USA to have partnered with All Children – All Families (ACAF) to implement LGBTQ-inclusive policies and practices. We successfully completed all activities as part of ACAF's 2020 Building Foundation for Inclusion cohort.

There is a growing movement within the CASA/GAL network and child welfare system that recognizes LGBTQ-inclusion is essential to achieving the goals of safety, permanency and well-being.

Accreditation was a rigorous year-long process, and CASA Child Advocates worked diligently to conduct an internal self-assessment, provide professional development to staff, and implement ACAF's Benchmarks of LGBTQ Inclusion.


