PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

2022 concludes a tremendous year for CASA Child Advocates of Montgomery County. We are proud to have settled into our new home, The Rock Center for Child Advocacy, with an enhanced ability to serve children.



We now have space within The Rock Center for Child Advocacy, The Watford Resource Center for Trauma Intervention, and The Amy Streifel Community Garden in which to hold community trainings, host events for teens in foster care, provide Trust-Based Relational Intervention (TBRI®) coaching to children and families, hold parent-child visits, and train our Advocates!

This new campus has set us apart from other CASA programs dramatically, and the physical space sets all those who visit at ease with a sense of peace. The central focus of our staff and Advocates continues to be on building connections with the children we serve and ensuring that their safety and best interest remain at the heart of their child welfare case.

CASA Child Advocates of Montgomery County continues to be a committed leader in collaborative efforts to help our community understand the impact of childhood trauma, improve outcomes for traumatized children, and lead efforts in family finding and preservation. We provided training to six community partner agencies comprising almost 200 individuals. We held a one-day Childhood Trauma Impact (CTI) Conference for over 300 professionals from across the county and state including judges, prosecutors/attorneys, law enforcement officers and personnel, teachers and school administrators, Texas Department of Family and Protective Services, community partners, and CASA Advocates.

Financial responsibility is always a priority for CASA Child Advocates of Montgomery County. We ended the year with 11 months of cash reserves for operating expenses. This is a goal set by our board, and it ensures our ability to continue to serve every single child in foster care in Montgomery County and explore areas for growth.

CASA Advocates change the trajectory of children's lives. The work we do is powerful. It is not only about the individual child in foster care for whom we are advocating. It is about the ripples of change that follow this child. Future generations will go on to live healthy lives, free from the cycle of trauma and abuse.

To this end, we are excited to share the expansion of our child advocacy work into truancy and juvenile justice cases. Children within these systems have often experienced similar trauma as the children in child welfare cases. These are children in desperate need of a committed adult to ensure their needs are met and that they, the child, remain the focus of the case. CASA Child Advocates of Montgomery County will serve as the pilot program for CASA's expansion into juvenile justice and truancy advocacy for the state of Texas.

None of this work would be possible without your generous support of the most vulnerable children in our community. Whether you are a donor, board member, volunteer, or someone with a heart for children, thank you. Thank you for your support as we begin this extension of our advocacy work. Your support sends the living message of a legacy of healed children and families.

Understanding Childhood Trauma

Childhood trauma is often described as serious adverse childhood experiences (ACEs). Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) defines ACEs as all types of abuse, neglect, and other potentially traumatic experiences that occur to people under the age of 18. Examples of ACEs include exposure to physical, emotional, or sexual abuse; physical and emotional neglect; and witnessing violence, serious mental illness, or substance misuse in the home. ACEs have profound psychological, physiological, and sociological impacts and can have negative, lasting effects on health and well-being.

A strong foundation

It all started with eight volunteers. Eight people who saw a need in Montgomery County and rose to the occasion.

Thanks to their tireless dedication and the endless hours of work put in by those who came after, CASA Child Advocates of Montgomery County is now more than 300 volunteers strong—37 times its original size.

Court-Appointed Advocacy

When a family is in crisis and becomes involved in the child welfare system, a judge may appoint a committed volunteer to advocate for the child. That volunteer is called a Court-Appointed Special Advocate®, or CASA.

Building a Trauma-Informed Community

Children can heal from the effects of Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACEs) and toxic stress if they develop healthy relationships with caring, reliable, safe, compassionate adults who guide them through the healing process.

HOW CASA IS MAKING A DIFFERENCE

Handle with Care Program

CASA Child Advocates of Montgomery County assisted in implementing and coordinating the Handle with Care program in Montgomery County with the Montgomery County District Attorney's Office in 2020. The Handle with Care program enables local law enforcement and Montgomery County Hospital District to notify local school districts when encountering a child at a traumatic scene. Then school personnel and mental health partners can provide appropriate trauma-sensitive interventions immediately. The program currently has 10 participating law enforcement agencies and 6 participating school districts across Montgomery County.



Trauma-Informed Montgomery County Task Force

CASA co-founded the Trauma-Informed Montgomery County Task Force in 2021. Representatives from about a dozen county agencies make up the Task Force, including the Montgomery County Sheriff's Office, the District Attorney's Office, the County Court of Law #3 (Montgomery County's dedicated child welfare court,) the Department of Family and Protective Services, CASA, Montgomery ISD, and Conroe ISD, among others.

Childhood Trauma Impact Conference

CASA and the Trauma-Informed Montgomery County Task Force hosted the first Childhood Trauma Impact (CTI) Conference for more than 300 community and state leaders in 2022. In attendance were professionals from an array of backgrounds, including law enforcement, education, healthcare, the judicial system, the child welfare system, and nonprofit organizations, all working with children who have experienced trauma.

Community Education and Training

CASA provided trauma-informed training for the following community partners in 2022: Association of Family and Conciliation Courts (60 attendees) | Angel Reach (30 attendees) ChampionX (20 attendees) | Child Protective Services-CVS Unit (15 attendees) Walker County CASA (45 attendees)

Supporting Children & Families with Trauma Intervention

Trust-Based Relational Intervention (TBRI®) is an attachment-based, trauma-informed intervention that is designed to meet the complex needs of vulnerable children. TBRI® uses empowering principles to address physical needs, connecting principles for attachment needs, and correcting principles to disarm fear-based behaviors. While the intervention is based on years of attachment, sensory processing, and neuroscience research, the heartbeat of TBRI® is connection.

TBRI® Practitioners at CASA Child Advocates

In 2016, the first CASA staff member completed TBRI® Practitioner Training. The CASA TBRI® Team was created with six Practitioners on staff in 2018. Today, CASA boasts fourteen TBRI® Practitioners on staff.

TBRI® Coaching

In 2022, the CASA TBRI® Team began offering on-site or virtual TBRI® coaching to eligible parents and/or caregivers/foster placements. Through one-on-one individualized coaching sessions, these Practitioners help children, their families, and other caregivers learn trauma intervention tools and practices focused on trauma-informed connecting, empowering, and correcting principles.

Assessments and Family Resources

CASA Advocates (court-appointed Guardian ad Litems) perform Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACEs) assessments for every child involved in the child welfare system in Montgomery County. The assessments are then included in the court report for the judge and others involved in the case.

CASA provides copies of The Connected Child and The Connected Parent to caregivers and parents. CASA also shares a cultivated TBRI® video playlist with parents and caregivers.

Helping Children Build Strong Foundations for the Future

Collaborative Family Engagement (CFE)

Collaborative Family Engagement (CFE) is a family-finding partnership between CASA and Child Protective Services (CPS) built around the fact that children have many relatives and other important connections that can be identified, located, and engaged with. This provides children and families with a dedicated support system that is meant to last after CASA and CPS involvement ends.

CASA Child Advocates of Montgomery County currently employs CFE in every case for children and families in the child welfare system. In 2022, the CASA CFE program implemented the following:

- Initiated the Family Connections Tool for all case supervisors to share with their Advocate teams.
 This tool helps volunteer Advocates create family trees; identify connections; conduct white page, inmate, and death record searches; and much more.
- Distributed CFE Tool video to Advocates monthly.
- Used Seneca Searches continually in family finding.
- Held CFE training for all Advocates on new expectations and tracking.
- Modified CFE tracking efforts for more accurate reporting.

CASA4Teens Program

The CASA4Teens program aims to increase successful outcomes for youth aging out of foster care. Last year, the CASA4Teens program accomplished the following:

- Held seven teen-focused events over the summer with more than 50 teens participating, including movie/game nights at CASA, Art Bus visits to shelters/residential treatment centers (RTCs), nutrition classes, bike repair and safety classes, and visit and presentation from Houston Museum of Natural Science
- Conducted 30 teen-related continuing education classes for Advocates on various topics, including ACEs and Toxic Stress, the Education and Training Voucher, Dyslexia, School District Foster Care Liaisons, and Youth Mental Health First Aid

Serving Every Single Child

Human trafficking, which is the exploitation of people for sexual servitude, forced labor, or financial gain, is rampant in many countries and is thought to generate over \$30 billion worldwide.



Educational Advocacy

The CASA Education Committee is made up of many specialists from the education field, mostly retired. This includes former administrators, counselors, diagnosticians, teachers, and more. The Education Committee focuses on two objectives:

- Training Advocates to collaborate with school personnel to achieve the best outcomes for children in care within the academic arena.
- Serving as resources for Advocates who need guidance in specific, case-related educational issues.

In 2022, the CASA Education Committee held three continuing education sessions for Advocates including dyslexia training, a Conroe ISD education panel, and an introduction to educational advocacy training. The committee also continued to answer questions posed by volunteer Advocates related to the success and struggles of children in school.

Anti-Trafficking Initiative

Foster children are particularly vulnerable to falling victim to sex trafficking and other forms of human trafficking.

CASA Child Advocates of Montgomery County continued its anti-trafficking program, and in 2022, the program accomplished the following:

- Participated in the Montgomery County Coalition Against Human Trafficking (MCCAHT) quarterly meetings.
- Trained in Love 146 Not a Number curriculum, which is an interactive child trafficking and exploitation prevention curriculum. It is designed to provide youth with information and skills in a way that inspires them to make better choices.

Focus on Inclusion and Diversity

Focusing on diversity and inclusion is a priority at CASA so that we can best serve our youth in care as well as support our volunteers, parents, and foster parents. LGBTQ+ youth are overrepresented in foster care. A recent study from the American Academy of Pediatrics found that more than 30% of youth in care identify as LGBTQ+, compared to about 11% of the general youth population. Statistics also show that LGBTQ+ youth are more likely to have a negative outcome during their time in care due to rejection and abuse.

CASA is committed to educating its staff and volunteers on the unique needs and risks of LGBTQ+ youth. CASA is certified through the Human Rights Campaign's program All Children - All Families (ACAF). All staff must complete annual training for certification. The training webinars are also available to all volunteers.

CASA was an exhibitor at The Woodlands Pride Festival in October 2022, attended by more than 7,000 people. CASA volunteers and staff spoke with hundreds of festival-goers about our work in the community and shared information on how to support CASA through volunteering or donations.


2022 Statement of Activities










Volunteers by Gender




